Modular Homes	Composed of factory-built modules that are transported to the home site and assembled.
	<ul> <li>Built to the state building code requirements of the state in which it is to be installed.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Conforms with industrialized building codes, Building Officials and Code Administrators (BOCA), and local zoning requirements</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>A blue BOCA tag must be displayed. The tag is typically found inside the home in one of the following locations:</li> </ul>
	<ul><li>Main electrical panel</li><li>Kitchen cabinet</li></ul>
	- Bedroom closet
	These homes are factory-built in two or more sections in accordance with state and local building codes and are transported to the property site for final assembly. While a modular home may be transported on a steel undercarriage, the undercarriage is not a permanent structural component. The undercarriage is usually removed when the house is placed on the foundation. This type of housing is built to
	meet the same code specifications as site-built homes. Modular homes are required to be on a foundation.
Panelized Home	Building in which panels, such as a whole wall with windows, doors, wiring and outside siding are factory-built, and then are transported to the site and assembled.
	<ul> <li>Built to the local building codes of the jurisdiction in which it is permanently located.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>A blue BOCA tag must be displayed. The tag is typically found inside the home in one of the following locations:</li> </ul>
	<ul><li>Main electrical panel</li><li>Kitchen cabinet</li></ul>
	- Bedroom closet
Manufactured	One-family dwelling unit
Home	Characteristics of site-built housing
	Legally classified as real property
	Built on a permanent chassis
	<ul> <li>Built and installed under the Federal Manufactured Home Constructions and Safety Standards (HUD Code) established June 15, 1976.</li> </ul>
	• A red HUD tag with a stamped serial number must be attached to the exterior of the home. The red tag is the manufacturer's guarantee that the
	home was built to conform to HUD's code.  These homes are residential structures built on a steel undercarriage with the wheel
	assembly necessary for transportation in one or more sections to a permanent
	location. The wheel assembly is removed when the residential structure is placed on
	a permanent foundation, but the steel undercarriage remains intact as a necessary
	structural component.  Additional Comment: Manufactured homes will have a Title showing ownership.
Mobile Home	Built prior to June 15, 1976 before the HUD code went into effect.
	<ul> <li>Supported by a chassis and is not permanently attached to the site.</li> </ul>
	Mobile homes are not required to display a HUD tag (red or blue) indicating
	conformance with the HUD building standard.
	Additional Comment: Mobile homes will have a Title showing ownership.
